SUMMARY

To serve as the Research and Presentation Development Intern with the aim of primarily supporting the President in creating Freedom 4/24's medical education material.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include the following. Other duties may be assigned.

- 1. Assist the President in conducting research for Freedom 4/24 medical education in order to update and refine pre-existing presentations. Research would include reviewing learning objectives successfully being implemented through other state's programming and ensuring all those components are accurately represented in our presentations.
- 2. Assist the President in creating updated support material for medical education including powerpoints, pre/post testing, etc.
- 3. Assist President with scheduling a focus group to preview and provide insight into the validity of content prior to certification.
- 4. Assist President with certification of content.
- 5. Other duties as assigned by the Freedom 4/24 staff.
