# What is human trafficking?

Human trafficking is the use of force, fraud, or coercion to compel a person into commercial sex acts or labor against their will to gain something of value.

Who is the most vulnerable to being trafficked?

- $\rightarrow$  History of sexual abuse  $\rightarrow$  Minorities
- $\rightarrow$  LGBTQ+
- $\rightarrow$  Poverty
- $\rightarrow$  Foster care  $\rightarrow$  Minors
- → Relational poverty/looking for love and support

# How does trafficking start?

**Relationship:** Most individuals are trafficked by their family members or someone they know

Boyfriending/Grooming: A romantic partner may manipulate you to do things out of your comfort zone

**Online:** Online interactions can be dangerous because traffickers may persuade you to meet in person and there is no way to know if someone is who they say they are

**Exploitation:** Explotation is persuading an individual to engage in sexual activity for something of value or an explicit image is posted online without permission
